

SINAM Graduate Young Investigator (GYI) Program Call for Proposal

Proposal Deadline: April 30, 2006

Program description

NSF Nanoscale Science and Engineering Center for Scalable and Integrated Nanomanufacturing (SINAM) is inviting applications for "Graduate Young Investigator" Program. The purpose is to offer the opportunity for graduate students in leading the research project with their innovative ideas. Graduate students from five SINAM partner Universities are invited to compete for innovative research ideas. The student to be selected will be required to propose a new and innovative research topic that involves at least two faculty members at SINAM from different fields, to study a nanomanufacturing topic using a multidisciplinary approach. This will allow the student to experience being a "driver" in research and inspire them to work across different disciplines. The student will combine the fund, with resources from the faculty advisers to conduct an exploratory research project. Deadline

Proposal is due by April 30, 2006 and final selection will be announced on May 15, 2006.

Award information

- Each GYI award size will be in amounts up to \$30,000 in a 12-month period. The grant will be used to support proposed research activities. The covered expenses may include purchasing for small instruments (<\$1,500 or per University's policy), supplies, cleaning room charges, and graduate student stipend.
- We plan to support one award during the period from July 1, 2006 to June 30, 2007.

Application Requirements

All applications for Graduate Young Investigator grant must include:

- The research topic must be new and proposed by the student. It should not be the extension of existing collaborations between two faculties.
- Research proposal (limited to 3 single-spaced pages, font size 12) that addresses the following:
 - o Brief review of relevant research literature and rationale for the proposed research
 - o Description of proposed research plan and goals
- Proposed budget breakdown (limited to ½ page)
- Student's curriculum vitae (one page)
- Endorsement statement from at least two SINAM faculty members (limited to ½ page)

Applicant eligibility

- The applicant needs to be registered as a full time graduate student at one of five SINAM partner Universities, including UCLA, UC Berkeley, Stanford University, UCSD, and UNCC.
- To ensure the continuity of the proposed research, the awardees are required to maintain their full-time student status during the funding period (i.e. can not be graduating students).

Submission of Proposals
